Aims: These two workshops are designed to assist those who wish to gain insight into the nature and causes of conflict and to acquire skills and confidence for dealing with disputes, whether in the workplace, families and relationships, neighbours, business partners or within the community.

Content:

- The three-day workshop explores types of conflict, negotiating styles, and the principles and process of the mediation model of conflict resolution. The model will be demonstrated and practised, with an emphasis on role-plays and feedback. Legal and ethical issues around the use of mediation will also be examined.
- The two-day workshop contains a continued emphasis on skills training, and examines issues such as power and cultural differences in relation to conflict resolution.

For those interested in practicing as Family Mediators, the 5 days of training comply with Family Law guidelines.

Child Inclusive Mediation Practice
